 \cdot Heather Wilson from the Cranberry Lake Mountaineer Snowmobile Club wanted to give an update of what the club has accomplished.

Received grants of \$42,500, which helped pay for ½ a groomer, a pole barn at the American Legion, fix the trail up little blue, fixing of the Manhattan Trail, 2 warming huts, one on Roaring Brook Club and one in the Windfall area, working on southern St. Lawrence County map. They have 3 groomers. Membership is up 21% this year.

• Mark Leroux mentioned that the property next to him on Lone Pine Road had a parking spot cleared on the other side of the road. During the process a spring was hit and now water is running down the road into his garage. The water is also freezing and making an ice hazard for traffic.

2022 Budget passed unanimously, going to see a 2.08% decrease in county taxes
