- Passed a resolution in opposition to the concealed carry for reenactments passed by the state
- Passed a resolution calling on climate act council to reject the replacement of fossil fuels, this would be detrimental to our economy

CORRESPONDENCE:

· National Grid letter – The Clifton Community Center is using a lot of electricity. Schedule National Grid to come and do an assessment. There is an electric hot water heater that may be the culprit, along with the 3 air conditioners, one is run 24/7 and two of them are old.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Clean up of Properties within the Town Nick has sent out second letters. Some work has been done, but not enough to satisfy the local law. The next step is to issue tickets.
- Update on new local law (litter control) no update from the town lawyer

- Parking in Newton Falls At the end of October the highway department will put up signs and talk to local law enforcement. We will not tolerate the issues that have occurred in the past. An add will be placed in the Bargain Hunter explaining what is to be expected.
- \cdot Town owned mowers Kelly says we have 1 ½ out of 3 mowers. The Community Center mower is messed up, should we call Wayne to see if he can rebuild, may be able to combine 2 to make 1. Kelly will get prices for a 54 or 48 inch cut mower for budget purposes.
